Definitions of Categories (ACEs)

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| Emotional abuse | This includes a parent or caregiver swearing at the child, putting them down, insulting them, or making them feel like they may be physically harmed. |
|--------------------|--|
| Physical abuse | This includes a parent or caregiver pushing, kicking, grabbing, hitting, or otherwise physically harming the child and leaving marks. |
| Sexual abuse | This includes an adult who was 5 years older than the child touching, fondling, or groping the child. This also includes and adult forcing the child to engage in sexual activities. |

Definitions of Categories (ACEs)

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Emotional neglect

Nobody in the child's family helped them feel important, valued, loved, or cared for. The family was not a source of support or strength.

Physical neglect

There was nobody to take care of the child, protect the child, or get medical treatment for them when needed. There was not enough food to eat, shelter to keep the child safe, no clean clothes, or parents were too high or drunk to take care of those needs.

Household substance abuse

A parent or caregiver was abusing alcohol or drugs.

Mental illness

A parent suffered from mental illness, including depression and suicide attempts.
